

Additional home programs offered by Cuyahoga County include:

Rehabilitation Loan Program:

The Department of Development administers this federally funded program. Individuals who meet income guidelines and live in the Urban County are eligible to apply for this program. For more information, call 216-348-4066.

Senior Deferred Rehab Program:

The Department of Development administers this federally funded program. Individuals 62 and older who meet income guidelines and live in the Urban County are eligible to apply for this program. For more information, call 216-348-4066.

Lead Remediation Program:

The Cuyahoga County Department of Development works cooperatively with local organizations and public health agencies to reduce the risk of lead poisoning in our homes and communities. To find out if you are eligible, please contact the appropriate agency directly.

Residents of Cuyahoga County: (except those living in the Cities of Cleveland and Cleveland Heights) should call the Cuyahoga County Board of Health at (216) 201-2000.

Cleveland Heights residents should contact Cleveland Heights City Hall at (216) 291-4444.

Residents of Cleveland should call Cleveland Health Department at (216) 263-5323.

Housing Enhancement Loan Program (HELP):

Loans can be used for maintenance, repair, remodeling, code violations and property upgrades. No income limit for borrower is required. The loan is available in 32 Cuyahoga County communities. Information can be obtained from the County Treasurer's office at (216) 443-2149.

What You Can Expect From Us

- Diagnostic testing such as: pressure pan, room-to-room, zone and worst case draft will be conducted in your home.
- Testing of your furnace, stove, & hot water tank to ensure it is operating within safety standards.
- Insulation of your attic & sidewalls.
- General repairs related to Weatherization work only.
- Our State and County certified contractors will clean up any debris left as a result of their work.
- All appointments for the initial & final inspections will be scheduled Monday-Friday between 8:00 am - 5:00 p.m.
- **Sorry, no weekend appointments.**
- **We do not replace windows or doors.**

What We Expect from You

- Keep scheduled initial & final inspection appointments.
- Allow at least 4 hours for each initial & final inspection appointment. Tests will be conducted during this time.
- Clear out your attic and make sure it is accessible for the inspector & contractor to perform their work.
- Exercise safety measures and keep children and pets away from the inspector's and contractor's work area.
- If you have a fireplace, please do not operate the fireplace on the scheduled dates for the initial inspection and final inspection. Make sure damper is closed.
- Someone 18 years of age or older will need to be available to sign the necessary paperwork at the completion of the job.

How to apply:

- You must be a resident of Cuyahoga County and reside in a city outside of the City of Cleveland.
- You must be a recipient of HEAP (Home Energy Assistance Program) and meet the 200% HWAP income guidelines.
